Fall/ Spring Cleaning tip - possible hazardous condition!

Our home is a Schwab built Agusta II. There is a potential fire hazard in the dryer vent system. The rain prevention cap on the top of the vent pipe has a tendency to plug up from lint. What we first noticed was no lint on the dryer filter. When I looked into the problem it turned out that the rain cap flapper was frozen in the closed position from a solid clump of lint. The flapper is supposed to move up and down freely, closed normally (bugs) and open from the dryer exhaust. It is a simple task to clear this problem, however it requires climbing on the roof. I suggest you put this info in the next edition of the FCHOA bulletin. It could also be a problem in other than Schwab homes

Aside from the fire hazard, it also makes the dryer much more efficient to run when clean. When we notice it takes too long to dry a load of towels, we know it's time to clean the vent again. Although we have a Schwab home also, I believe this is an issue for many homes regardless of builder.

We've been cleaning our out roof vent about 2x/year for many years now. We have the acorn/oak leaves cleaned from the rain spouts/gutters at the same time.
